- 1. What are the benefits for me?
- 2. What are the risks for me?
- 3. What other options do I have in terms of other studies or standard of care?
- 4. How do the risks and benefits compare to the other options?
- 5. What were the previous results from this treatment or similar treatments?
- 6. Why do researchers believe this new treatment is an improvement?
- 7. What is the purpose of the study?
- 8. How experienced is the team running the trial?
- 9. What are the patient eligibility criteria?
- 10. Is the study controlled or uncontrolled?
- 11. Is the study randomized and blinded?
- 12. What kinds of tests and experimental treatments are involved?
- 13. What is the duration and types of follow-up tests and treatments?
- 14. If the results are positive, will I be a able to continue with the treatment?
- 15. Who is responsible for complications and side effects from the trial?
- 16. Is travel required?
- 17. How long will the trial last?
- 18. Will hospitalization be required?

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- 19. Who will pay for the treatments?
- 20. Will I be reimbursed for other expenses?
- 21. What type of follow up care is part of this study?
- 22. How will I know that the experimental treatment is working?
- 23. Will results of the trials be provided to me?
- 24. Who will be in charge of my care?



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
